Number Overload

The army officers can't keep up with the number of rugby players volunteering to fight. Can you use your knowledge of percentages to work out the number of new army recruits?

e.g. 300 people joined the army yesterday. Today, 80% of that number joined. How many people joined the army today?

$$300 \div 10 = 30$$

$$30 \times 8 = 240$$

240 people joined the army today.

10% of 200

15% of 360

90% of 700

20% of 280

30% of 500

50% of 600

45% of 300

60% of 480

- Present opinion as fact
